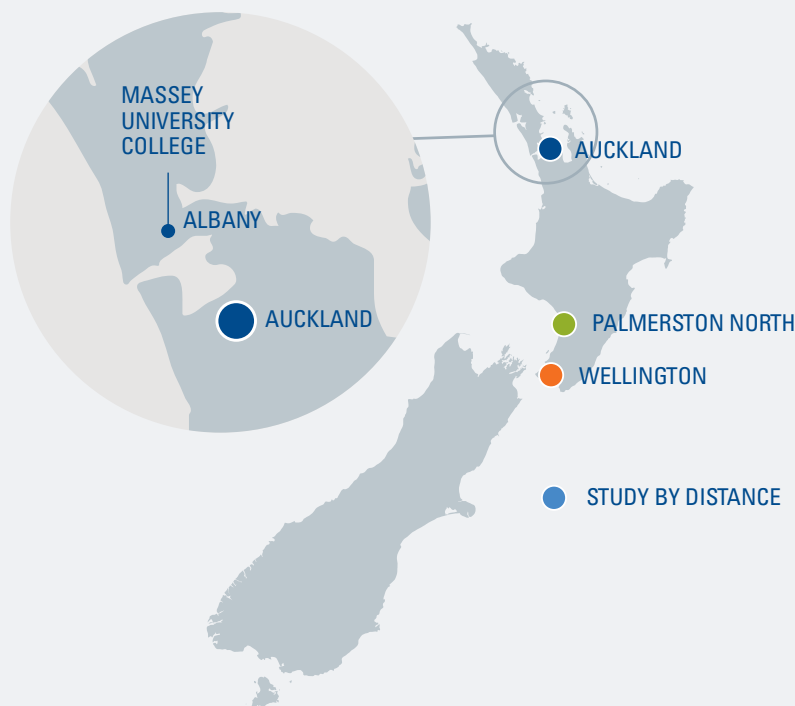
The campus is across the harbour from central Auckland, 15km away.

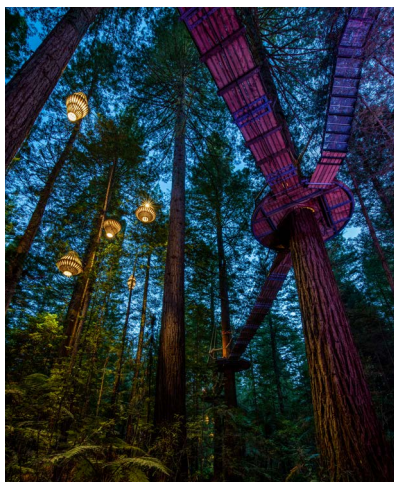

Discover the diverse range of cafes and restaurants, buzzing nightlife of the central city, art galleries and museums, famous Sky Tower and farmers' market in Matakana.

Auckland is built on a volcanic landscape and surrounded by the Manukau and Waitematā Harbours. In fact, it's known as the 'City of Sails' because of the great number of yachts that sail in the harbours and the adjoining Hauraki Gulf.

A quick ferry trip will take you to the scenic islands of Waiheke and Rangitoto, while stunning walks and gorgeous beaches like Takapuna and Mission Bay are only a short drive away.

- > Halls of residence and apartments – live right on campus and meet new people from all over the world in either a self-catered apartment or hall of residence.

- > Independent rental and share house accommodation.

Please note: accommodation for under-18 international students is limited to a homestay option. Living with a relative or family friend will need to be approved as a homestay provider with proof of age, residency, and police checks. There will be extra charges for the under-18 checks.

COST OF LIVING

In terms of living costs, Auckland compares favourably against other major cities including London, Sydney, Melbourne, Hong Kong, Singapore and New York.

Before granting a student visa, Immigration New Zealand will require you to show you can support yourself for the first year.

As an international student, New Zealand law also states you need to have medical and travel insurance. The easiest option is to buy insurance through StudentSafe which we'll offer to you when you pay your fees.

Our College is your alternative pathway to starting your degree at Massey University.

Here are the study options we offer to help you bridge the gap.

If you don't meet the academic requirements for admission to Massey University undergraduate programmes, the Foundation Certificate (International) can help bridge the gap. It will prepare you for undergraduate study by improving your English and academic skills as well as subject-specific knowledge relating to your chosen degree. This programme is your pathway into the first year of an undergraduate degree at Massey University.

For students who commence their studies in October they need to complete their Foundation programme over 2 trimesters to start at Massey University in semester 2.

The Foundation Certificate (International Accelerated) will help improve your English and academic skills, and prepare you for undergraduate study at Massey University. Entry requirements into the accelerated programme are higher than the standard one because it has a shorter duration of 4 months. Upon successful completion of this Certificate, you are guaranteed admission to all non-selective University undergraduate programmes at Massey University.

English Language Pathways

Our College offers two English language pathway programmes: General English and English for Academic Purposes.

GENERAL ENGLISH

Our General English (GE) programme is designed to improve your core skills in reading, writing, listening, and speaking. Students improve their ability to communicate in English with confidence in everyday situations and feel prepared to take on further academic study in New Zealand. Each week you will be expected to participate in 20 hours of classroom instructed study and up to 6.5 hours of self-study including research or projects.

The General English syllabus and course dates have been carefully designed to allow students a smooth transition from English to tertiary studies.

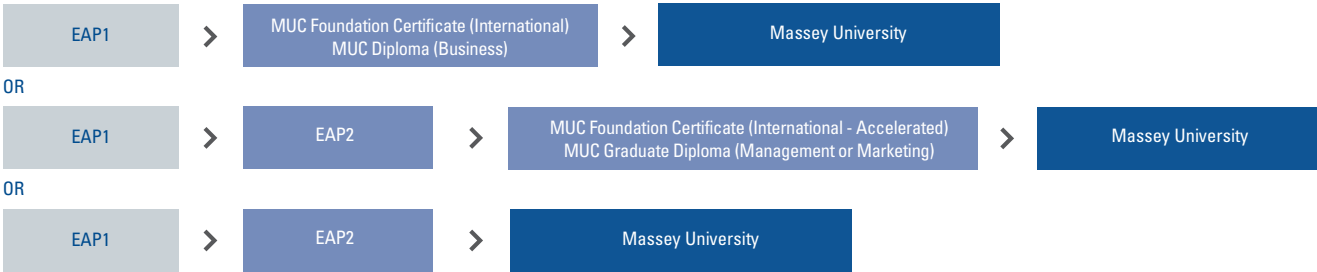

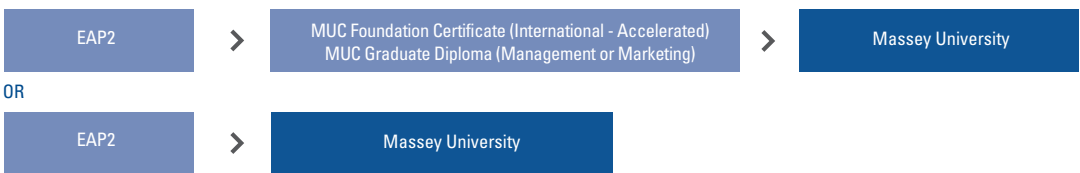

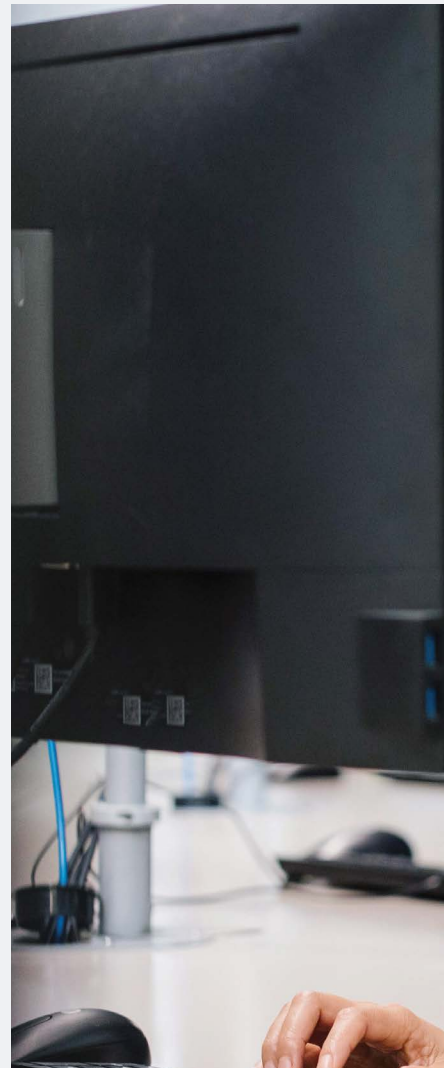
